AJCCA Board Meeting and Workshop



The ASEAN-Japan Cybersecurity Community Alliance (AJCCA) held its first board meeting of 2025 on **18th February in Vientiane, Laos**, to review past achievements and set the agenda for the year. A key outcome was the launch of the Threat Intelligence Sharing Working Group (TIS WG), which includes five ASEAN cybersecurity associations, including Brunei Cybersecurity Association (BCSA). The group aims to enhance regional cybersecurity by facilitating structured threat intelligence sharing and developing a joint platform for intelligence exchange and analysis.

AJCCA hosted its first **Cyber Threat Intelligence Workshop**, uniting ASEAN and Japan cybersecurity experts, government representatives, and national agencies. Speakers shared insights on threat intelligence, data leaks, and cybersecurity strategies. A panel discussion emphasized collaboration, trust-building, and standardized frameworks, addressing challenges like data sensitivity and legal barriers. Participants stressed academia's role and pilot projects to enhance regional cybersecurity resilience.

Fauzan delivered a quick talk on OSINT Fundamentals, then followed by a OSINT in Practice (Workshop) by Rahman. The event ended with a mini Capture the Flag that allowed participants to put what they learnt into practice.

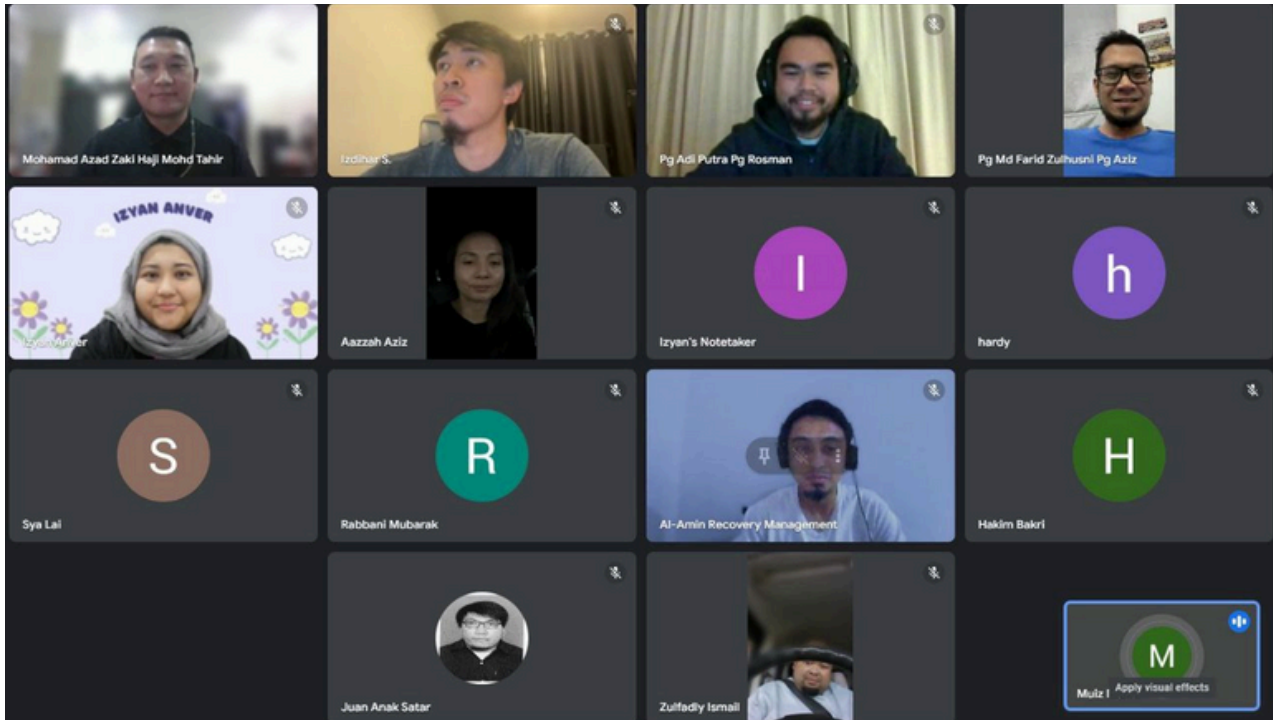
Authority for Info-communications Technology Industry: Personal Data Protection Sprint
