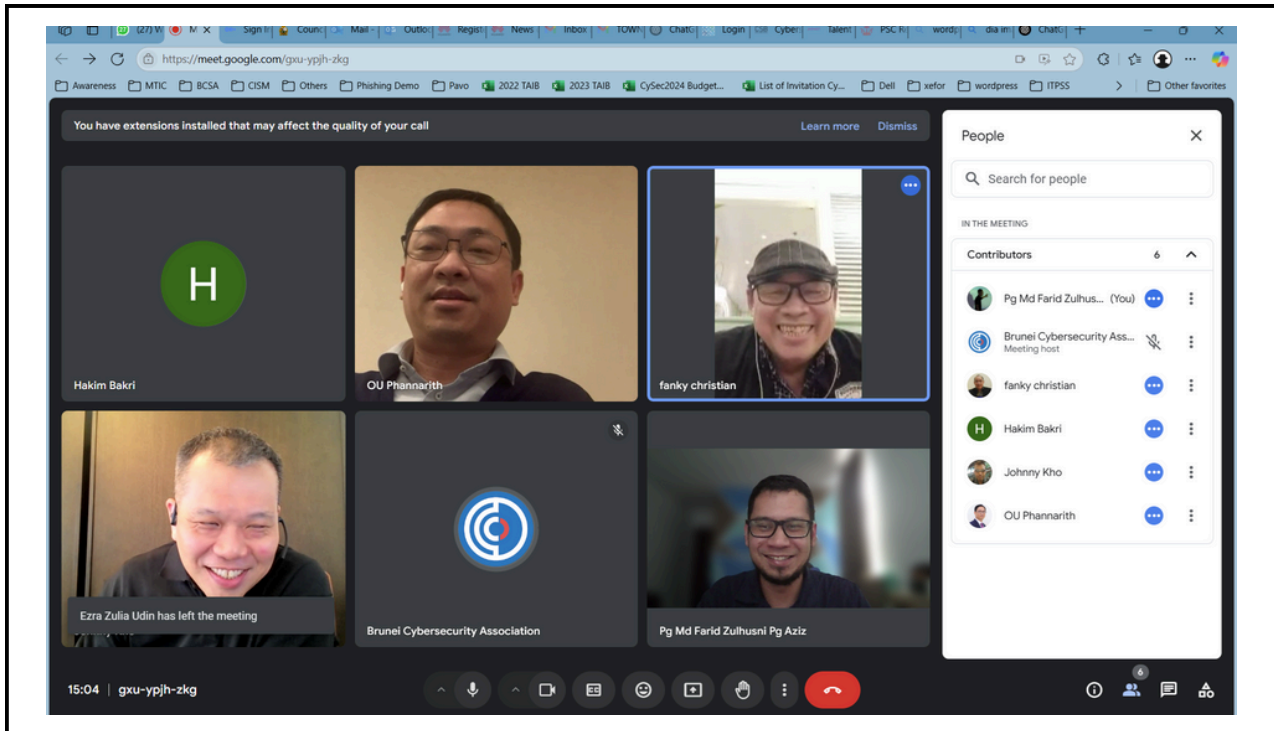

SEACC Online Meeting



The online meeting serves to update the national cybersecurity community on recent developments, ongoing initiatives, and strategic collaborations within the Southeast Asia Cybersecurity Consortium (SEACC). It follows up on the physical meeting held in Brunei during CySec 2024, maintaining the momentum of regional cooperation in cybersecurity. Hosted by the Brunei Cyber Security Association (BCSA) and moderated by its Vice President, Hakim Bakri, the session brings together key representatives from Brunei, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Cambodia, the Philippines, Vietnam, Myanmar, and Thailand to share their national updates and plans.

The meeting provides a platform for countries to report on cybersecurity activities and progress made from October 2024 to March 2025, while also outlining their upcoming initiatives for the rest of the year. These plans include conferences, workshops, training programs, policy development, and joint projects. The session not only promotes stronger collaboration but also encourages the exchange of best practices and shared responses to emerging cyber threats. Looking forward, Cambodia has been designated as the host for all SEACC meetings in 2025, reinforcing continuous engagement and regional commitment to cybersecurity advancement.

Cyber673 Session #5

The **Cyber673 sessions in March** covered a range of cybersecurity topics, blending theoretical knowledge with practical, hands-on experience.



Held during Ramadhan, focused on enhancing cybersecurity awareness and practical application. The session featured two distinct talks, beginning with "Cyber Threat Intelligence (CTI)" by Rabbani A., which provided a foundational understanding of CTI programs, outlining their core principles and processes. Following this, Izdiyar presented "Defend Your Org," a talk specifically tailored to provide practical cybersecurity guidelines for Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs).

The presentation centered around the NIST Cybersecurity Framework (CSF) 2.0, offering attendees a structured approach to organizational defense.

The session concluded with the inaugural "SahurCTF," a Capture The Flag competition created to reinforce the defensive cybersecurity concepts covered in Izdiyar's talk. This hands-on element allowed participants to directly apply their newly acquired knowledge in a simulated environment.

Cybersecurity Awareness Talk and Distribution of Anti-Virus to Private School



On **17 March 2025**, the Brunei Cybersecurity Association (BCSA), in collaboration with the Department of Private Education (JPS), held a ceremony at STPRI to officially hand over Trend Micro antivirus licenses to bolster cybersecurity in Brunei's academic institutions.

The licenses were part of Trend Micro's CSR initiative, following their donation of 15,000 licenses at the Brunei Cybersecurity Conference (CySec) in September 2024—10,000 for educational institutions and 5,000 for SMEs.

The event was attended by representatives from **94 private educational institutions**, along with BCSA and JPS officials.

The event highlighted BCSA's efforts to promote cybersecurity in education through opening remarks by **Mohamad Azad Zaki bin Haji Mohd Tahir**, President of BCSA; a cybersecurity awareness session on current threats and preventive measures by **Mohammad Zulfadly bin Awang Haji Ismail**, Executive Committee Member of BCSA and member of ANAK IT BN; and the distribution of antivirus licenses led by **Mohammad Hakim bin Haji Bakri**, Vice President of BCSA. The initiative reflects BCSA's ongoing commitment to enhancing Brunei's digital safety and encourages wider community participation in strengthening cybersecurity awareness.

Brunei Cyber Security Association Executive Committee 25th Meeting



The BCSA Executive Committee held its 25th meeting on Friday, 28th March 2025, from 2:00 PM to 3:30 PM via Google Meet. The session brought together key leaders to review and strategize across several core areas. Discussions included a postmortem of the Annual General Meeting (AGM), updates to the organizational chart, and insights from the recent Global ACE Body of Governors (BoG) Meeting.

The committee also addressed membership matters, upcoming awareness initiatives, and the Ladies in Cyber (LIC) program. In addition, planning for CySec 2025 and BCSA's participation in the Brunei Mid-Year Conference and Exhibition (MYCE) were highlighted as key agenda items.

Enactment of Personal Data Protection Order 2025



The **Personal Data Protection Order (PDPO) 2025** was enacted on **January 2025**, which establishes the legal framework for the governance and regulation of personal data handling within the private sector.

The **Authority for Info-communications Technology Industry of Brunei Darussalam (AITI)** is the Data Protection Authority responsible to administer and enforce the Order

AITI has initiated various awareness campaigns and capacity building programmes to current and future Data Protection Officers. It is hoped that organisations achieve a thorough understanding of the PDPO and implement necessary measures during the designated sunrise period prior to its enforcement.

Organisations are encouraged to adopt best practices in personal data management and to appoint a Data Protection Officer.

3 Simple Habits to Strengthen Your Organization's Cybersecurity Posture

Cyber threats are evolving, but sometimes, the best defenses are simple, consistent practices. Here are three easy-to-implement habits that can significantly reduce your organizational cybersecurity risk:

- **Enable Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) Everywhere**
 - MFA blocks 99% of automated attacks. Ensure its enforced for all critical systems, such as email, VPNs, and cloud apps and privilege accounts. If MFA isn't an option, require strong, unique passwords.
- **Patch Promptly (Especially for Known Vulnerabilities)**
 - Many breaches exploit unpatched systems. Automate updates where possible and prioritize critical patches (e.g., zero-days). A well-managed patch cycle closes easy attack avenues.
- **Conduct Regular Phishing Simulations**
 - Human error is a top cause of breaches. Monthly phishing tests (with training for failures) keep employee's alert. Report suspicious emails? Celebrate that—it means awareness is working!

Small, consistent actions create a resilient security culture. What's one habit your team can commit to this month?

Threat Intelligence Report: Web Defacement and Data Theft Targeting Government Websites in Indonesia



On **February 11, 2025**, the official website of Indonesia's Attorney General's Office (kejaksaan.go.id) suffered a significant cybersecurity breach. The attackers, identifying themselves through Instagram handles [@unrooter.id](#), [@raja_jawal9xx](#), and [@fablo_kecil](#), defaced the site and claimed to have exfiltrated sensitive information. Allegedly compromised data includes personal details, case files, and health records of prosecutors and staff. A public statement from the perpetrators threatened further data exposure. This incident underscores ongoing vulnerabilities in government digital infrastructure and reinforces the urgent need for enhanced cybersecurity measures.

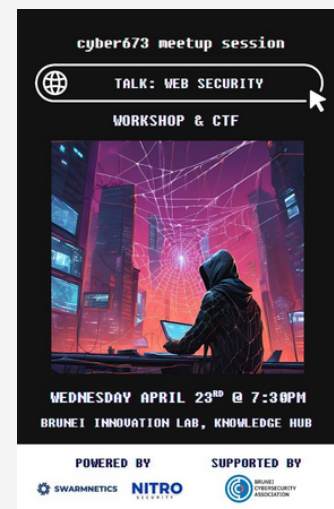
